“Clean Energy Certifications and Accreditation Incentives”

The New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) have incentives to support training program accreditation, clean energy company accreditation, and practitioner certifications. NYSEDA has funding available on a first come, first serve basis to support:

1) **Training Program Accreditation** from the Interstate Renewable Energy Council Institute for Sustainable Power Quality (IREC ISPQ). Qualified New York State training organizations in the System Benefits Charge (SBC)¹ service territories can receive reimbursement for 80% of the cost, up to \$5,000, for obtaining IREC ISPQ program accreditation for energy efficiency and renewable energy training programs.

2) **Company Accreditation:**

A) *North American Board of Certified Energy Practitioners (NABCEP) Company Accreditation* (and accreditation renewals). Eligible companies, located statewide, can receive reimbursement for 100% of the cost of NABCEP PV company accreditation and accreditation renewals, capped at \$1,800 annually.

B) *Building Performance Institute (BPI) Company Accreditation* (and accreditation renewals). Eligible companies, located statewide, that acquire BPI accreditation or accreditation renewals can receive 50% reimbursement, capped at \$1,800 annually.

3) **Individual Certifications:**

A) *NABCEP Photovoltaic (PV), Solar Thermal (ST) and Underwriters Laboratory PV System Installer Certification* (and certification renewals). Eligible individuals located statewide who successfully obtain NABCEP PV, ST or UL PV System Installer certifications may be eligible to receive 100% reimbursement of the costs associated with certification exam and application fees. Incentives are capped at \$1,000 per certification and \$3,000 per individual.

B) *Non-BPI Energy Efficiency Individual Certifications* (and certification renewals). Eligible individuals, located in SBC territory who successfully obtain energy efficiency related certifications or certification renewals from third-party national organizations² may be eligible to receive 50% reimbursement of the costs associated with certification examination and application fees. Incentives are capped at \$600 per certification and \$6,000 per individual.

C) *BPI Certifications* (and certification renewals). Eligible individuals located statewide who successfully obtain BPI related certifications or certification renewals may be eligible to receive 50% reimbursement of the costs associated with certification examination and application fees. Incentives are capped at \$600 per certification and \$6,000 per individual.

¹ Applicants (companies, training organizations, or individuals) must be located/reside in a System Benefits Charge (SBC) service territory. Introduction

The New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA) have incentives to support training program accreditation, clean energy company accreditation, and individual certifications. NYSERDA has funding available on a first come, first serve basis to support:

- 1) **IREC ISPQ Program Accreditation of Training Programs** - Qualified New York State training organizations located in SBC service territories can receive reimbursement for 80% of the cost, up to \$5,000, for application for IREC ISPQ program accreditation for energy efficiency and renewable energy training programs. **See Attachment A and Form A.**
- 2) **Company Accreditation:**
 - A) NABCEP Company Accreditation (and accreditation renewals) for Solar PV companies: Eligible companies located statewide can receive reimbursement for 100% of the cost of NABCEP PV Company Accreditation, up to \$1,800 annually. **See Attachment B and Form B.**
 - B) BPI Company Accreditation (and accreditation renewals) for home performance companies: Eligible companies located statewide that acquire accreditation or accreditation renewals from the Building Performance Institute qualify to receive 50% reimbursement, capped at \$1,800 annually. **See Attachment B and Form B and.**
- 3) **Individual Certifications:**
 - A) NABCEP and UL Certifications: Eligible individuals, located statewide who successfully obtain NABCEP PV, ST and/or UL PV Installer certifications or recertification may qualify to receive 100% reimbursement for the costs associated with examination and application fees. Incentives are capped at \$1,000 per certification and \$3,000 per individual. NYSERDA counts toward the cap any certification reimbursement received by an individual starting January 1, 2012. Please note that this is for NABCEP and UL "CERTIFICATIONS" only. This is NOT for general certificates of completion or "passing score achievement documents" that are sometimes issued for entry level exams. **See Attachment C and Form C.**

- B) B) *Non-BPI Energy Efficiency Individual Certifications* (and certification renewals) - Eligible individuals, located in SBC territory who successfully obtain energy efficiency related certifications or certification renewals from third-party national organizations³ may be eligible to receive 50% reimbursement of the costs associated with certification examination and application fees. Incentives are capped at \$600 per certification and \$6,000 per individual. NYSERDA counts toward the cap any certification reimbursement received by an individual starting January 1, 2012. **See Attachment C and Form C**
- C) C) *BPI Certifications* (and certification renewals) – Eligible individuals, located statewide who successfully obtain BPI related certifications or certification renewals may be eligible to receive 50% reimbursement of the costs associated with certification examination and application fees. Incentives are capped at \$600 per certification and \$6,000 per individual. NYSERDA counts toward the cap any certification reimbursement received by an individual starting January 1, 2012. **See Attachment C and Form C.**

Eligibility

All individuals and companies applying for incentives under PON 2397 **MUST** have a [W-9](#) on file with NYSERDA Finance Department. Please include a W-9 with your first application package. Limitation - This solicitation does not commit NYSERDA to award payment. NYSERDA reserves the right to accept or reject any or all applications received, or to cancel in part or in its entirety the solicitation when it is in NYSERDA's best interest.

Disclosure Requirement - The applicant shall disclose any indictment for any alleged felony, or any conviction for a felony within the past five years, under the laws of the United States or any state or territory of the United States, and shall describe circumstances for each. When an applicant is an association, partnership, corporation, or other organization, this disclosure requirement includes the organization and its officers, partners, and directors or members of any similarly governing body. If an indictment or conviction should come to the attention of NYSERDA after the award of a contract, NYSERDA may exercise its stop-work right pending further investigation, or terminate the agreement; the contractor may be subject to penalties for violation of any law which may apply in the particular circumstances. Attachment A

IREC ISPQ Program Accreditation of Training Programs

Background

The Interstate Renewable Energy Council (IREC) is the North American licensee for the Institute for Sustainable Power Quality (ISPQ) standards, and implements the framework of standards and metrics to provide a means to compare content, quality, and resources across a broad range of training programs covering renewable energy, energy efficiency, and distributed generation technologies. This international framework ensures legitimacy of what is being taught and by whom.

The IREC ISPQ International Standard 01022 identifies requirements for competency, quality systems, resources, and qualification of curriculum by which trainers and training programs can be evaluated. The IREC ISPQ Credentialing Program has approved four job task analyses (JTAs) developed by the National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) with U.S. Department of Energy (U.S. DOE) funding as a resource for applicants from the energy efficiency and weatherization sectors. The JTAs are the result of an industry-led collaboration to define the minimum knowledge, skills and abilities required of workers in four job classifications in the home energy retrofit industry: Retrofit Installer Technician, Crew Leader, Energy Auditor, and Quality Control Inspector.

In addition, IREC Standard 14732:2013 *General Requirements for Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency Certificate Programs* has been published and is available on the [IREC Website](#). This national standard provides a foundation for the accreditation of certificate programs that develop and administer credit or non-credit energy efficiency and renewable energy-related training. It describes requirements for administration, curriculum, assessment, personnel, equipment, facilities and linkage with industry that programs must meet to demonstrate that they issue a market-valued certificate.

All applicants applying for incentives for IREC ISPQ accreditation must: 1) completely fill out Form A; 2) provide accreditation certificate; 3) provide the first page of a recent electric bill with the company name and address to verify eligibility; and 4) provide a W-9 or include the Tax Identification number on Form A. Company Accreditation and Accreditation Renewals: PV and Energy Efficiency

Background

The North American Board of Certified Energy Practitioners' (NABCEP) PV Company Accreditation Program and the Building Performance Institute have established benchmark requirements with respect to staffing and company policies. These requirements provide a way for PV companies and home performance and energy efficiency companies to distinguish themselves by adhering to a set of industry-recognized best practices. PV companies that qualify for accreditation have to meet all the requirements set forth by NABCEP (www.nabcep.org) and pass a minimum of three randomly selected inspections of completed PV installations. Energy Efficiency companies that qualify for BPI¹ accreditation must agree to abide by the terms and conditions in the BPI Accreditation Agreement and comply with the list of obligations (www.bpi.org).

Attachment C

Individual Certifications: PV, ST, Energy Efficiency

Background

Certification is a procedure by which an independent third-party organization gives written assurance that an individual conforms to specified standards, usually by requiring a written, and sometimes a field or practical examination. As a result of meeting the requirements and passing the exam, professionals receive their certification that publicly witnesses their proficiency.

NYSERDA's Solar PV incentive program (PON 2112), currently requires eligible installers to fulfill either NABCEP certification or IBEW-NECA (International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers-National Electrical Contractors Association) Electrical Journeyman and Apprentice Training requirements.

The UL PV System Installer Certification requires an individual to pass an exam intended to measure the necessary competencies for a qualified electrical professional with OSHA 30-hour safety training for construction and several years of hands-on experience in the field. NABCEP's program for professional certification (for system design, sales and/or installation) has achieved American National Standards Institute (ANSI)¹ accreditation.

NYSERDA's Home Performance with ENERGY STAR[®] (HPw/ES) requires participating contractors to obtain and maintain BPI Company Accreditation and a participating contractor must dedicate a different BPI Certified Professional for each Market Region in which it chooses to operate. BPI certifications (Building Analyst, Envelope Professional, Heating, and Air Conditioning and Heat Pump) demonstrate capabilities of diagnosing critical performance factors in a home that impact comfort, health, safety, durability and energy efficiency. The BPI Residential Building Envelope Whole House Air Leakage Installer has achieved ANSI accreditation, and BPI has recently earned ISO 17024 accreditation of its advanced Home Energy Professional (HEP) certifications by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI). The four certifications -Energy Auditor, Retrofit Installer, Crew Leader and Quality Control Inspector- are the only credentials available to the home performance and weatherization industry that are supported by the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) and its National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) and accredited by ANSI. The four HEP certifications provide advanced certification options and will not replace BPI's existing certifications in the industry. These new credentials complement and build upon BPI's existing certifications in the home performance career ladder, where increased knowledge and skills lead to advancement. They are designed to allow professionals in the home energy upgrade industry to build both a stackable and lateral career lattice.

NYSERDA will provide financial support to individuals and participating partners obtaining certifications related to energy efficiency skills and competencies necessary to meet the goals of the SBC or EEPS programs. Eligible individuals are those, for example, who achieve certifications from the Building Performance Institute (BPI), Association of Energy Engineers (AEE), International Facility Management Association (IFMA), American Society of Heating Refrigeration and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE), Northwest Energy Efficiency Council Building Operator Certification (BOC), National Council on Qualifications for the Lighting Professions (NCQLP), North American Technician Excellence (NATE), and other certifications relevant to energy efficiency skills and competencies. In the future, other certifications that have achieved the same standard will be considered and may be eligible for incentives under this program.

¹ ANSI/ISO/IEC 17024 specify requirements which ensure that organizations operating certification systems for persons operate in a consistent, comparable, and reliable manner. This accreditation includes rigorous requirements for examination development and maintenance and for quality management systems. ANSI/ISO/IEC 17024 has been approved by 85 countries.

Funding

- A) **NABCEP PV and ST and UL PV System Installer Certifications:** Eligible individuals, located statewide who successfully obtain NABCEP PV, ST and/or UL PV System Installer certifications or recertification may qualify to receive 100% reimbursement for the costs associated with examination and application fees. Incentives are capped at \$1,000 per certification and \$3,000 per individual. NYSERDA counts toward the cap any certification reimbursement received by an individual starting January 1, 2012. Please note that this is for NABCEP and UL “CERTIFICATIONS” only, and is NOT for general certificates of completion or “passing score achievement documents” that are sometimes issued for entry level exams.
- B) *Non-BPI Energy Efficiency Individual Certifications* (and certification renewals) - eligible individuals, located in SBC territory who successfully obtain energy efficiency related certifications or certification renewals from third-party national organizations³ may be eligible to receive 50% reimbursement of the costs associated with certification examination and application fees. Incentives are capped at \$600 per certification and \$6,000 per individual. NYSERDA counts toward the cap any certification reimbursement received by an individual starting January 1, 2012.
- C) BPI Certifications (and certification renewals) – eligible individuals, located statewide who successfully obtain BPI related certifications or certification renewals may be eligible to receive 50% reimbursement of the costs associated with certification examination and application fees. Incentives are capped at \$600 per certification and \$6,000 per individual. NYSERDA counts toward the cap any certification reimbursement received by an individual starting January 1, 2012.

Application Requirements

Applicants applying for reimbursement of costs associated with the fees for certification must: 1) completely fill out **Form C**; 2) provide proof of successfully obtaining certification (Certificate of Completion); (3) provide paid invoices for eligible costs (see Funding section above); 4) provide the first page of a recent electric bill with the company name and address to verify eligibility; and 5) provide a W-9 or include the Tax Identification number on Form C. Incentives will not be paid unless a W-9 is on file.

² For applicants (companies, training organizations, or individuals) must be located/reside in a System Benefits Charge (SBC) service territory. (Areas with electric service provided by Central Hudson Gas and Electric Corp., Consolidated Edison of NY, Inc., NYS Electric and Gas Corp., National Grid, Orange and Rockland Utilities, Inc., and Rochester Gas and Electric.)

The incentive payment for practitioner certifications will be made in one lump sum once the reimbursement application has been reviewed and approved by NYSERDA and in accordance with NYSERDA's Prompt Payment Policy Statement (Exhibit B to Attachment D).
